### **Purpose**

Through its annual Honor Awards program, the AIA Grand Rapids Chapter recognizes excellence in architecture throughout the region. The program promotes the value of good design and encourages members to pursue excellence through their work and service to the public.

The mission of AIA Grand Rapids is to support and advance the profession of architecture in our community. In support of this mission, the program celebrates our chapter architects and their work, promotes the profession, honors clients, and acknowledges contributions to the construction industry. With this as our cornerstone, we are creating the foundation for building recognition of the profession through stronger promotion of architecture to the public and better alignment with state and national component award programs.

# AIA Grand Rapids

## Building and Design Award Categories

Categories are modeled after state and national awards programs of the American Institute of Architects and are as follows:

1. Building Award
  2. Interior Architecture Award
  3. Regional and Urban Design Award
  4. Small Commercial Design Award (Under \$2 Million Dollars in Construction Value)
  5. Residential Architecture Award
  6. *Housing Next* Affordable Housing Award
  7. Unbuilt Project Award
  8. Student Project Design Award
- The jury will consist of practicing architects from outside the Chapter or State.
  - Projects will be judged individually, not in competition with each other.
  - The jury will be encouraged but is not required to select recognition for a minimum of one project in each of the awards categories. There is no minimum or maximum number of awards that will be required of the jury.
  - Projects may be submitted under multiple categories, but a separate entry and entry fee must be submitted for each.
  - All built entries shall be architectural projects substantially designed by licensed architects within the State of Michigan who satisfy Section 2010(1) of the state licensing act. Unbuilt or Student projects do not need to be completed by a licensed architect.
  - Projects may include new construction, renovation, or adaptive reuse.
  - All projects are welcomed (residential, commercial, institutional, etc.).
  - Entries are limited to work by members of the AIA Grand Rapids Chapter.
  - Entries for the Student Project category are limited to students attending an architecture program at a NAAB accredited program in Architecture. The project must have been completed during the junior, senior, or master years of study. The applicant must be a resident of the AIA Grand Rapids Chapter area while attending a university outside the area or be a non-resident but attending a university in the chapter area. The AIA Grand Rapids chapter area includes the counties of Ionia, Kent, Lake, Mason, Mecosta, Montcalm, Muskegon, Newaygo, Oceana, Osceola, and Ottawa.
  - Entries from multi-office firms are limited to work produced by their AIA Grand Rapids Chapter office.
  - Entries shall be executed projects with the exception of the Unbuilt or Student projects.
  - Entries shall have been completed in the past three years (**after January 1, 2016**).
  - Entries that have won awards in other programs are eligible for submission.
  - Entries that have received an AIA Grand Rapids award in a previous year are not eligible in the specific category submitted but may be submitted in another category. Non-winning entries may be resubmitted if building completion was not prior to the prescribed date. Firms are encouraged to re-enter non-winning projects previously submitted.
  - The intent of the AIA Grand Rapids Honor Awards Program is to honor those firms and individuals responsible for the submitted designs. AIA Grand Rapids has always honored other team members as part of the awards process; however, it is critical to the integrity of the awards that proper credit for the design of each project be provided by all submitting firms. Failure to communicate this process and requirements to other associated firms will result in disqualification, and there are no refunds.
  - The decision of the jury is considered final. Protests/appeals must be submitted in writing to the chapter President. The Awards Committee will review, but it is not obligated to resolve.
  - All entries shall be submitted in the manner herein specified by **5 p.m., Friday, August 2, 2019**. No exceptions will be made.

## Entry Fees

- Each paid submission will receive:

  - One award plaque. Additional award plaques may be purchased through AIA Grand Rapids.
  - Inclusion in any media announcement(s) and publicity.

The entry fee for the **Unbuilt Project Award** category is **\$50.**

- Each paid submission will receive:
  - Inclusion in the digitally-generated presentation display (content provided by submitting firm).
  - Inclusion in any media announcement(s) and publicity.

The entry fee for the **Student Project Design Award** is **\$25.**

- Each paid submission will receive:
  - One prepaid admission ticket for the AIAGR Honor Awards Program.
  - One award plaque. Additional award plaques may be purchased through AIA Grand Rapids.
  - Inclusion in the digitally-generated presentation display (content provided by submitting firm).
  - Inclusion in any media announcement(s) and publicity.

Entry fees for the **Firm Achievement Award** category are **\$350.**

There are no entry fees for the **Young Architect, Architect of the Year,** and **David D. Smith Humanitarian Award** categories. Entry Slips are due by **Friday, July 19, 2019.** No exceptions will be made.

## Additional Fees

- Honor Awards Program tickets will be available for a fee of **\$50.00** each.
- **Emerging Professional** tickets will be available for a fee of **\$25.00** each. The AIA defines **Emerging Professionals** as architecture students, intern architects, and architects licensed less than 10 years.
- Additional Honor Awards Program **Student** tickets will be available for a fee of **\$10.00** each.

## Public Relations Program

- AIA Grand Rapids will endeavor to give wide publicity to the winning entries and program itself.
- It is essential that photographic material not be restricted against publication in connection with the AIA Grand Rapids Honor Awards Program. It is the entrant's responsibility to make sure all photographic materials are cleared for release.
- AIA Grand Rapids shall not assume responsibility for copyrights or photographic fees.
- The photographer's credit line will be given when requested.
- AIA Grand Rapids will generate a digitally generated presentation display including all projects submitted (winning and non-winning) and will follow a standardized digital format. The winning projects will be appropriately designated.



## **ENTRY SUBMISSION FOR BUILDING AND DESIGN AWARD CATEGORIES**

1. **Submission PDF** (15 pages total saved as a single PDF; this PDF will go to the jury):
  - Project Description: Please describe your project in 300 words or less, including the following: significant dates (project start/end dates); challenges faced; purpose and scope of the activity; long-range impact or benefits realized on the users of the building; innovative approaches to the project.
  - A site plan and/or floor plan and any additional drawings and images to give the jury a thorough and comprehensive understanding of the entry.
  - Firm name should **NOT** be listed anywhere in the presentation, as this will go to the jury.
2. **Images/Photos** (these will be used on the AIAGR website and in any media announcement(s) and publicity):
  - Please include 5 project images in JPEG format.
  - Images should be a minimum resolution of 1920 x 1080 pixels.
  - File Name Protocol: The file name should be a generic title of the project and numbered in the sequence that you would like to see projected (01 being the best image that you would want used for promotional purposes).
  - **Tips and Hints:**
    - Third generation copies of images often have focus or color problems; avoid them.
    - Money spent on quality images can help reduce the number required. Submitters are encouraged to solicit the use of a professional photographer. Check clarity of images before submittal.
    - Choose your images with care. The images must reinforce the strength of the design. If the jury is uncertain why they are shown, doubts about quality arise.
    - Order: Your images tell a story that should support your design statement.
    - Plans: Plan views can help, but they must be simple and clear, especially if there is new and existing work. The jury must be able to understand at a glance.
    - Rights to photos, electronic images, and plans must be cleared for publication by the entrant. Entrants are responsible for any royalties or copyright photography fees. The entrant further agrees that it shall indemnify and hold harmless The American Institute of Architects Grand Rapids against all claims or damages arising out of the use of any information or other materials supplied by the entrant. All errors and omissions are the sole responsibility of the entrant.
3. **1 (One) Title Slide (see webpage link for editable PowerPoint Slide)**
4. **Project Description** in Word format (this will be used on the AIAGR Website):
  - Please describe your project in 300 words or less, including the following: significant dates (project start/end dates); challenges faced; purpose and scope of the activity; long-range impact or benefits realized on the users of the building; innovative approaches to the project.
  - This can be the same project description that is used in the submission PDF above but can include firm name.
5. **Abbreviated Project Description** in Word format (this will be included in any media announcement(s) and publicity): Please describe your project in 30 words or less.

## **BUILDING AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Building Award:**

The following criteria apply to the building award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The building award is open to a single or related group of buildings (all types, large and small) including new construction and renovations.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements or design advancement. Projects may also be exemplary in
- technical advancement.

**Fee for Building Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.

## **INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Interior Architecture Award:**

The following criteria apply to the interior architecture award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The interior architecture award recognizes the excellence and diversity of interior projects.
- Projects must demonstrate design resolution of architectural interiors, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements or design advancement. Projects may also be exemplary in technical advancement, environmental advancement, and preservation/restoration.

**Fee for Interior Architecture Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.



## **REGIONAL AND URBAN DESIGN AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Regional and Urban Design Award**

The following criteria apply to the regional and urban design award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The purpose of the honor awards for regional and urban design is to recognize distinguished achievements that involve the expanding role of the architect in urban design, city planning, and community development.
- The awards seek to identify projects and programs that involve public participation and contribute to the quality of the urban environment.
- Owners, individual practitioners, private design firms, public agencies, civic organizations, and public interest groups may submit nominations for projects and programs in which they were involved.
- Submissions may include urban design projects, planning programs, civic improvements, environmental programs, and redevelopment projects.
- Since many urban design projects are never completed in the traditional sense, “incomplete” projects or ongoing programs may be recognized if a significant portion has been completed, implemented, or adopted by a local jurisdiction.

**Fee for Regional and Urban Design Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.

## **SMALL COMMERCIAL DESIGN AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Small Commercial Design Award:**

The following criteria apply to the small commercial design award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The small commercial project award is open to a single or related group of buildings, including new construction and renovations under \$2 million dollars in construction value. Final construction cost must be submitted.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements or design advancement. Projects may also be exemplary in technical advancement.

**Fee for Small Commercial Design Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.

## **RESIDENTIAL ARCHITECTURE AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Residential Architecture Award:**

The following criteria apply to the residential architecture award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees and deadlines.

- The residential architecture award is open to single-family and two-family type construction. Multi-family residential projects are not allowed in this category.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements or design advancement. Projects may also be exemplary in technical advancement.

**Fee for Residential Architecture Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.



## **HOUSING NEXT AFFORDABLE HOUSING AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for *Housing Next* Affordable Housing Award:**

The following criteria apply to the *Housing Next* Affordable Housing Award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees and deadlines. *Housing Next* is an initiative focused on supporting housing solutions for all income levels in our community.

- The *Housing Next* Affordable Housing Award is open to single-family, two-family, and multi-family residential type construction.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which successfully bring down the cost of single-family, two-family, and multi-family homes through efficiency and simplicity of design while still maintaining a high-quality build that is embraced by the surrounding neighborhood. Projects may also be exemplary in technical advancement.

**Fee for *Housing Next* Affordable Housing Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.

## **UNBUILT PROJECT AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Unbuilt Project Award:**

The following criteria apply to the unbuilt project award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The unbuilt project award is open to a single or related group of buildings (all types, large and small), including new construction and renovations. Interiors are also acceptable for this category.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements or design advancement and innovation. Projects may also be exemplary in technical advancement.

**Fee for Unbuilt Project Award:** A fee of **\$50.00** is required.

## **STUDENT PROJECT DESIGN AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Student Project Award:**

The following criteria apply to the Student project award. Refer to general information contained above as it relates to this category, including awards, eligibility, fees, and deadlines.

- The Student project award can be a built or unbuilt project designed by a student within the last 5 years but cannot be affiliated with an architecture firm.
- Projects must successfully demonstrate design resolution, which shows skill and sensitivity in resolution of functional and technical requirements and innovation.
- Entries for the Student Project category are limited to students attending an architecture program at a NAAB accredited program in Architecture. The project must have been completed during the junior, senior, or master years of study. The applicant must be a resident of the AIA Grand Rapids Chapter area while attending a university outside the area or be a non-resident but attending a university in the chapter area. The AIA Grand Rapids chapter area includes the counties of Ionia, Kent, Lake, Mason, Mecosta, Montcalm, Muskegon, Newaygo, Oceana, Osceola, and Ottawa.

**Fee for Student Project Award:** A fee of **\$25.00** is required.



## **FIRM ACHIEVEMENT AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Firm Achievement Award**

This award is given to any current practicing architectural firm in business for a minimum of five (5) years. The award is presented to a firm that is well known and respected within the architectural community and has clearly demonstrated continued leadership and contributions in any aspect of the architectural profession, the AIA, or the community.

*The Jury for the Building and Design Awards Program also serves as the selection committee for this award.*

### **Nominations for Firm Achievement Award**

Any member or firm in good standing with AIAGR may submit a nomination. In the event the firm has multiple offices, the above criteria shall represent the efforts of the office located within the AIA Grand Rapids II county region.

**Fee for Firm Achievement Award:** A fee of **\$350.00** is required.

### **Submissions shall contain the following:**

- One copy in PDF format. Entries shall be made in landscape PDF format only.
- A one-page nomination letter or statement of nomination speaking to the overall achievement of the firm. The nomination letter should address as many of the following issues as are relevant but are not limited to: design creativity, technical innovation, longevity and consistency of practice, Intern Development Program (IDP) success, economic success, client satisfaction, leadership, success in the construction process, community leadership, and contributions.
- Ten pages maximum of exhibits, diagrams, or drawings illustrating reasons for nomination.
- Please include the name and address of the firm, the name of the owner or principal, and a name and phone number for the contact person.

### **General Requirements for Firm Achievement Award:**

- No more than one award will be given per year.
- A firm can win only once every five years.
- Recipient firm, if any, to be notified prior to the Honor Awards Program.
- The recipient firm will receive two tickets to the Honor Awards Program.
- Winner may have up to five minutes to speak and acknowledge their appreciation.

### **Deadlines**

- All entries and individual nominations must be submitted via instructions to be eligible for an award.
- Registration/entry fees are due by **5 p.m., Friday, July 19, 2019**. Award Submissions are due by **5 p.m., Friday, August 2, 2019**. No exceptions will be made.

## **YOUNG ARCHITECT AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for Young Architect Award**

This award recognizes proficiency and exceptional accomplishments in and contributions to the profession and/or the community by an architect who has been a member of AIAGR for a minimum of three years and has been licensed to practice architecture fewer than 10 years by the submission deadline (after August 2009) . The term “young architect” has no reference to the age of the nominee.

### **Selection Committee for Young Architect Award**

*The AIAGR President, Vice-President, and up to three past-Presidents.*

### **Nomination for Young Architect Award**

Any member or firm of AIAGR may submit a nomination.

**Fee for Young Architect Award:** No fee required.

### **Submissions shall contain the following:**

- One copy in PDF format. Entries shall be made in landscape PDF format only.
- A one-page nomination letter or statement by nominator.
- A biography of the candidate not to exceed two pages, including contributions.
- Exhibits in support of the nominee that demonstrate accomplishments.
- A maximum of three letters of support by those who know the quality of the nominee’s work and contributions.
- Photograph of candidate.

### **General Requirements for Young Architect Award:**

- More than one award may be granted per year at the discretion of the selection committee.
- Recipient, if any, to be notified prior to the Honor Awards Program.
- The recipient will receive two tickets to the Honor Awards Program.
- Winner may have up to three minutes to speak and acknowledge their appreciation.

### **Deadlines**

- All entries and individual nominations must be submitted via instructions to be eligible for an award.

## **ARCHITECT OF THE YEAR AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for the Architect of the Year Award**

This is the highest honor that AIA Grand Rapids can bestow upon a member and no more than one will be granted a year. This lifetime achievement award is presented to an architect who has clearly demonstrated distinguished leadership in any phase of the profession whose work has had a lasting influence on the theory and practice of architecture over an extended period. Candidates must have demonstrated great depth and breadth having a cumulative effect on the profession of architecture. Nominees must be members of AIA Grand Rapids and should demonstrate dedication to the ideals of the American Institute of Architects, significant contributions to the profession and service to the community. The Architect of the Year Award may be awarded posthumously. Current members of the AIA Grand Rapids Board of Directors may not enter.

### **Selection Committee for Architect of the Year Award**

*The Jury for the Building and Design Awards Program.*

### **Nomination for Architect of the Year Award**

Any member or firm of AIAGR may submit a nomination.

**Fee for Architect of the Year Award:** No fee required.

### **Submissions shall contain the following:**

- One copy in PDF format. Entries shall be made in landscape PDF format only.
- A one-page nomination letter or statement by nominator.
- A biography of the candidate not to exceed two pages, including contributions.
- Exhibits in support of the nominee that demonstrate accomplishments.
- A maximum of three letters of support by those who know the quality of the nominee's work and contributions.
- Photograph of candidate.

### **General Requirements for Architect of the Year Award:**

- No more than one award may be granted per year.

## **DAVID D. SMITH HUMANITARIAN AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

### **Criteria for David D. Smith Humanitarian Award**

This award is named in honor of the late David D. Smith and is presented to a member of the Grand Rapids community (nominee does not have to be an architect) who represents community service and leadership, while elevating public awareness of architecture and the built-environment through the creation of enduring places.

This award is made in recognition of outstanding achievement in one or more areas of professional endeavor and/or of notable contributions to the communities of the AIA Grand Rapids region.

### **Selection Committee for David D. Smith Humanitarian Award**

*The AIA Grand Rapids President, Vice President, Grace A.M. Smith RA, and up to three past-Presidents.*

### **Nominations for David D. Smith Humanitarian Award**

Any person who resides or works within the geographic area of the AIA Grand Rapids may submit a nomination.

**Fee for David D. Smith Humanitarian Award:** No fee required.

### **Submissions shall contain the following:**

- One copy in PDF format. Entries shall be made in landscape PDF format only.
- A one-page nomination letter or statement by nominator.
- A biography of the candidate not to exceed two pages, including contributions.
- Describe the candidate's accomplishments as a humanitarian.
- A maximum of three letters of support by those who know the quality of the nominee's work and contributions.
- Photograph of candidate.

### **General Requirements for David D. Smith Humanitarian Award:**

- More than one award may be granted per year at the discretion of the selection committee.
- Recipient, if any, to be notified prior to the Honor Awards Program.
- The recipient will receive two tickets to the Honor Awards Program.
- Winner may have up to five minutes to speak and acknowledge their appreciation.

### **Deadlines**

- All entries and individual nominations must be submitted via instructions to be eligible for an award.
